Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time: "A Soul Worth More Than Gold"



In Luke 12:13 - 21, Jesus tells the story of a man who had everything—wealth, security, and plans for a comfortable future. His barns were bursting, yet his soul was starving. He had prepared for many years of ease, but not for the moment that truly mattered: the call to eternity.

This parable is not a condemnation of success or planning, but a gentle and urgent reminder that life's true value is not found in possessions, but in purpose. The rich man's mistake wasn't his abundance—he assumed that abundance alone was enough.

Jesus invites us to look inward and ask: What am I storing up? Are we investing in what lasts—compassion, forgiveness, generosity, and faith? Or are we building bigger barns for things that cannot follow us beyond this life?

To be "rich in what matters to God" means living with open hands and open hearts. It means seeing each day as a gift, each person as sacred, and each act of love as a treasure that echoes into eternity. May we seek not just to live well, but to live wisely—anchored in grace, guided by love, and rich in the things that truly endure.

In the stillness of this moment, I come to You with
an open heart.
Thank you for the gift of today, for its quiet
blessings and unseen grace.
When I feel weary, be my strength.
When I feel uncertain, be my guide.

Help me to see Your light in others,
