



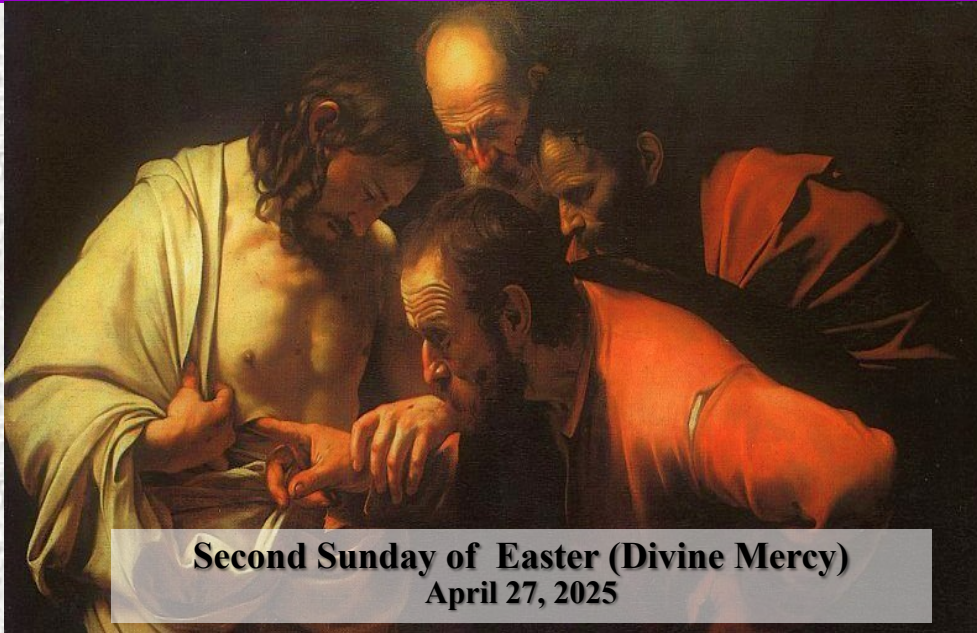

Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy):

"Peace Be With You: Embracing the Gift of Divine Mercy"



On this Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday, we encounter the Risen Lord stepping into the midst of His fearful disciples, proclaiming, “Peace be with you” (John 20:19). It is a moment saturated with grace: Jesus does not scold or reprimand them for abandoning Him during His Passion. Instead, He brings peace, shows His wounds, and breathes on them the Holy Spirit, instituting the sacrament of reconciliation. Here, we witness the very heart of Divine Mercy—God’s boundless love that meets us not in our perfection, but in our failure, fear, and doubt.

Thomas, often remembered as “Doubting,” embodies the struggle many of us face. He wants proof—he wants to see and touch the wounds. But in his honest yearning, Jesus meets him too, not with condemnation, but with invitation: “Put your finger here... do not be unbelieving, but believe” (John 20:27). Divine Mercy does not demand blind faith—it responds to our wounded hearts with tenderness. It invites us, even in our questions, into a deeper relationship. And when Thomas finally proclaims, “My Lord and my God!” he gives voice to what faith looks like when touched by mercy. This Gospel reminds us that Divine Mercy is not merely an abstract idea or a once-a-year celebration. It is the very mission of the Church. Just as Jesus breathed the Spirit on His disciples and sent them out to forgive sins, so too are we called to be bearers of mercy in a broken world. We are not sent because we are strong or flawless, but because we have experienced the mercy of the Risen Christ and now become its witnesses.

As we gaze upon the image of Divine Mercy, with the rays of blood and water flowing from the heart of Jesus, we are reminded that His mercy is always flowing toward us—especially in our need. So let us open our hearts to that mercy today. Let us receive His peace, echo Thomas’ confession of faith, and carry Divine Mercy into the lives of those around us. For in a world often locked behind doors of fear, it is the mercy of Christ that still breaks through and brings resurrection.

Prayer: Embracing the Gift of Divine Mercy



*Risen Lord Jesus,
You entered the locked room where fear had silenced faith,
and with love more powerful than death, You spoke,
“Peace be with you.”*

Speak that same peace into our hearts today.

*Let Your mercy wash over our doubts, our failures, and our wounds.
You did not turn away from Thomas in his questioning, but invited him to touch Your wounds and believe.
So too, we bring You our uncertainties, trusting that Your mercy welcomes us as we are
and calls us deeper into faith and love.*

*Breathe on us Your Holy Spirit, the Spirit of forgiveness and renewal.
Send us forth as instruments of Your Divine Mercy— to forgive, to heal, to love as You have loved us.
May the rays of Your mercy flow through our lives into a hurting world.*

*Jesus, we trust in You—
our Lord and our God, now and forever. Amen. Alleluia!*

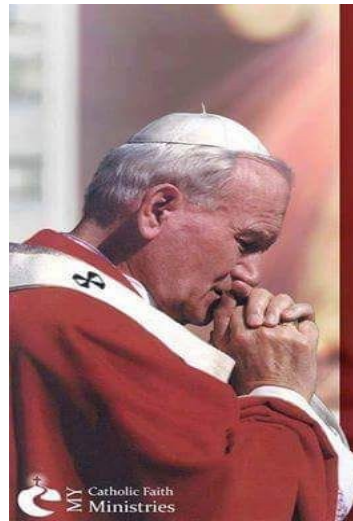
